News from Tougo, January–May 2026

At the Land Development Unit, following the supervision of excavation work for infiltration ponds



and trenches to construct anti-erosion dikes in the NAMENGBE-ZANGA perimeter of Rasko in 2025, technicians and planners began this year by installing fencing and barbed wire around the perimeter. Once the fence was installed, the trenches were backfilled. In the coming days, we will proceed with the installation of the sliding gates and barriers. It should be noted that the perimeter is currently 60% complete.



A **public meeting** was held in the village of Ridimbo, following a request made by farmers since 2024 to the Tougo pilot farm. This meeting provided an opportunity to explain the ins and outs of a hedgerow perimeter. Several people attended the meeting, which also included the participation of traditional authorities.

In addition, a feasibility study was conducted with the future beneficiaries

before surveying began. The results indicate that the site covers an area of 30 hectares. This is an important milestone for the TIPWEOGO Association (), which, following its first perimeter, is now seeing new hedgerow perimeters emerge in other villages. This strengthens our impact in the restoration of degraded lands within our area of operation.





In terms of organizational activities, board meetings were held monthly to review completed activities and plan for future ones.

Additionally, in the test fields, the zai pits have been dug. We are waiting for a good rain to begin sowing.

For the period from January to May, only one rainfall of 7 millimeters was recorded.



As part of the project to construct 10 wells and a school, funded by MISSION ENFANCE in 9 member villages of the TIPWEOGO Association, two successful wells were found: one in Rasko with a flow rate of 6 cubic meters, and the other in

Tougo with a flow rate of 4 cubic meters. The construction of the wellheads has already been completed. In the coming months, work is planned to develop the areas surrounding the boreholes.

At the nursery, seedling production has begun and is progressing very well. In total, more than 6,000 seedlings, including baobab, *Cassia sieberiana*, *Randga*, and *Albizia lebbek*, etc.
